Faculty Position - Proteomics

The Department of Biochemistry and Microbiology leads in molecular biological research at the University of Victoria with research programs aimed at improving human health and the environment. The department is the academic home of the University of Victoria - Genome BC Proteomics Research Centre. The Centre is recognized internationally for the development of novel technologies for protein analysis.

The department invites applications for a tenure track faculty position at the rank of **assistant or associate professor**. The successful applicant is expected to develop an independent, proteomics-based research program that complements the aims of the Proteomics Centre and the research strengths of the department. The department is particularly interested in applicants with experience in systems level proteomics or large-scale studies of protein structure, function, and interactions. Applications from researchers with expertise in lipidomics, glycomics, or metabolomics, bioinformatics or other biology based omics-disciplines are also encouraged.

The deadline for application is 15 January 2012. Applicants should provide electronic versions of a CV, a detailed description of their proposed research program and how it relates to proteomics research, a statement on teaching experience and objectives, and arrange for electronic letters from no more than 3 referees to be received by the application deadline.
